

ORDINANCE NO. 12-1959

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF KISKIMINETAS,
ARMSTRONG COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, VACATING PARTS
OF STATE HIGHWAY ROUTE 379, SECTION R-2, ALL
WITHIN THE BOUNDARY LIMITS OF SAID TOWNSHIP.

The Board of Supervisors of Kiskiminetas Township,
Armstrong County, Pennsylvania, under the authority of
"The Second Class Township Code" of the Laws of the Common-
wealth of Pennsylvania, Act of May 1, 1933 P. L. 103, as
amended, does enact and ordain as follows:

Section 1. All those parts and portions of State
Highway Route 379, Section R-2, all being within the
jurisdictional boundary limits of Kiskiminetas Township,
described as follows:

a point at Station 18+35 to
From/a point at Station 18+69, a distance
of approximately 285 feet, or approximately
.0540 of a mile; and from a point at Station
20+08 to a point at Station 29+40, a dis-
tance of approximately 932 feet or approx-
imately .1766 of a mile; and from a point
at Station 30+58 to a point at Station
42+25, a distance of approximately 1,167
feet or approximately .2210 of a mile;
and from a point at Station 62+20 to point
at Township Road No. 347, a distance of
approximately 400 feet or approximately
.0758 of a mile; and also from a point at
Station 78+43 to a point at Station 85+97,
a distance of approximately 754 feet or
approximately .1428 of a mile, all of which
is more fully shown and described on blue-
print of the Department of Highways which
is attached hereto and made a part of this
ordinance.

shall be and the same is hereby vacated. This vacation is

made by reason of the relocation of said parts of said road and their subsequent abandonment by the Commonwealth as a part of the highway system; said abandoned parts of said road being ~~useless~~, burdensome and unnecessary for public convenience.
