

ORDINANCE NO. 4-69

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT, LAY-OUT, WIDEN AND OPEN CERTAIN ROADS WHOLLY WITHIN KISKIMINETAS TOWNSHIP, ARMSTRONG COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AS PART OF THE ROAD SYSTEM OF SAID TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, all or a majority in interest of the owners of property or properties have petitioned, or in the judgment of the Supervisors, as the case may be, have decided, in the interest of public convenience, to lay-out, widen and open and adopt by ordinance, certain roads wholly within the Township as part of the road system of said Township, now therefore, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Supervisors of Kiskiminetas, and it is hereby ordained and enacted,

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the petitions aforesaid, or, in the judgment of the Supervisors, the following described roads be, and the same are adopted, laid out, widened and opened as part of the road system of Kiskiminetas Township.

The following streets or roads in the Shellhammer Plan, known as Orchard Hills, all being forty (40) feet in width.

All of Short Street, all of Pennsylvania Avenue, the remaining portion of South Avenue from Pennsylvania Avenue to Florida Avenue, and that portion of California Avenue which runs from the new State Highway Route No. 56 to the old State Highway Route No. 56.

SECTION 2. That in the judgment of the Supervisors the above roads are necessary for the public convenience, and the Township Solicitor is authorized and directed to file the certified copy of the Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Quarter Sessions of Armstrong County, together with the release of damages signed by the abutting property owners, where necessary, and a draft or survey of each road.

Ordained and enacted into law by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Kiskiminetas in

lawful session assembled this 30th day of December, 1969.
