

ORDINANCE NO. 4 -74

AN ORDINANCE LAYING OUT, OPENING AND ADOPTING CERTAIN ROADS AND STREETS COMPLETELY WITHIN THE BOUNDARY LIMITS OF KISKIMINETAS TOWNSHIP, ARMSTRONG COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AS PART OF THE STREET AND ROAD SYSTEM OF SAID TOWNSHIP.

The Supervisors of Kiskiminetas Township hereby enact and ordain as follows:

Section 1. The following described streets and roads are hereby laid out, opened and ordained as public streets and roads in the Township of Kiskiminetas, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania:

(a) All of Spring Drive in the Greenbriar Plan of Lots, being a fifty (50) foot wide street, from its intersection with State Highway Route 56 Northwardly for a distance of five hundred (500) feet to its cul-de-sac terminus, as shown on the Greenbriar Plan of Lots recorded in Armstrong County Plan Book Volume 3, Pages 144 and 145.

(b) Part of Third Street in the Miller Plan of Lots, being a fifty (50) foot wide street, from the intersection of said Third Street and Clark Avenue Westwardly for a distance of four hundred ninety (490) feet, more or less, to the Western terminus of said Third Street, as shown on the Miller Plan of Lots recorded in Armstrong County Plan Book Volume 2, Page 151.

(c) All of Casella Lane, located in the unrecorded McKinsty Hill Plan of Lots, being a thirty-three (33) foot wide road, from its intersection with Township Road No. 536, commonly known as McKinsty Hill Road, Eastwardly for a distance of eight hundred fifty (850) feet.

(d) All that certain unnamed street or alley, located in the unrecorded McKinsty Hill Plan of Lots, being a twenty (20) foot wide street or alley, from its intersection with Township Road No. 536, commonly known as McKinsty Hill Road, Westwardly between Lots 1, 2 and 3 and Lots 4, 5 and 6 in said Plan, for a distance of five hundred seventeen (517) feet, more or less, to the Western terminus of said street or alley.

(e) All of Redtown Street, located in the Village of Redtown, being a forty (40) foot wide street, running East and West between the twelve, fifty-foot wide, lots comprising the Village of

Redtown, for a distance of three hundred (300) feet from one terminus to the other terminus of said street.

(f) Part of Redtown Road, being a thirty-three (33) foot wide road, from its intersection with the West terminus of Township Road No. 333 in a Westwardly direction for approximately one-tenth (0.1) mile, then veers sharply left in a Southwardly direction for approximately one-tenth (0.1) mile to the North line of the Village of Redtown, then continues Southwardly through the Village of Redtown for one hundred fifty (150) feet, more or less, and intersects with Redtown Street.

Section 2. This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to petitions filed by property owners abutting said streets, roads and alleys, and in the judgment of the Supervisors, the adoption of said streets, roads and alleys as part of the street and road system of said Township is necessary in the interest of public convenience.

Section 3. The said streets, roads and alleys are completely within the boundary limits of said Township, and the same shall become a part of the system of streets and roads of said Township.
