

ORDINANCE NO. 7-55

Of the Board of Supervisors of Kiskiminetas Township, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania, defining disorderly conduct and providing penalties for violation thereof.

The Board of Supervisors of Kiskiminetas Township, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania, a municipal or quasi-municipal corporation under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, hereby ordains as follows:

Disorderly Conduct Prohibited. Disorderly conduct within the limits of the Township of Kiskiminetas shall be and is hereby defined as any act, word or conduct causing or tending to cause a disturbance of the peace and good order of the Township, or causing or tending to cause any danger, discomfort, or annoyance to the inhabitants of the Township or users of the Township Thoroughfares. Disorderly conduct shall include, but shall not be limited to: loafing, fighting, vagrancy, the making of unnecessary noises, and indecent language. All the foregoing offenses, as coming within the definition of disorderly conduct are hereby declared to be unlawful. Any person or persons violating any provision of this ordinance or causing or helping to violate it shall be subject to a fine or penalty of not more than ten dollars (\$10.00) for each offense, and in default of payment of such fine or penalty together with costs of prosecution, shall be committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days.
